

Death on the Gambia

It is the spring of 1939. Across Europe, countries are preparing for war. However, a smaller drama is about to unfold in the distant British colony of Gambia as the tramp riverboat *Christabel* starts a routine trip from Georgetown to the capital, Bathurst.

The air is hot and humid, the mosquitoes ubiquitous, and the waters slow moving. It is a two-day journey to Bathurst. Two days cut off from the outside world, with only a brief stop at Mansa Konko to break the monotony. Much can happen in two days...

In *Death on the Gambia*, the two-day journey from Georgetown to Bathurst will be played out over the course of a single evening. The passengers aboard the *Christabel* include a journalist, a big game hunter, an archaeologist, a detective, an artist and a missionary. The players can form alliances, blackmail each other, steal items and money and maybe even try to kill one another. Along the way, they may solve some of *Death on the Gambia's* mysteries. How many people are needed for Death on the Gambia?

Death on the Gambia is for 8 to 11 guests—plus one host (the game coordinator).

The step-by-step guide explains which characters to omit if you have fewer than 11 guests (you need at least 8, however).

If you have even more guests, we have a few free extra characters for *Death on the Gambia* that come with the game.

Please note that with 8 or 9 guests, the host plays Captain Ironheart as well as hosting the game. (The game explains how to do that.)

How does *Death on the Gambia* work?

Death on the Gambia runs for three or four hours and suits a buffet meal. The host acts as organizer, responsible for making sure everything runs smoothly. The host does not count towards the maximum or minimum number of players.

Your guests are all present aboard the *Christabel*, a riverboat. They are passengers or crew and have their own goals and agendas; how they choose to achieve those goals is up to them. *Death on the Gambia* is an evening of double-dealing, intrigue, secrets and maybe even murder!

WAR IN EUROPE?
