RAAF EXPANSION PLANNED

An expansion of Roswell Army Air Field starts next month with the addition of a new runway and hangars for advanced jets.

RAAF is already home to the 509th Bombardment Wing of Strategic Air Command. The 509th flies the trusty Boeing B-29 Superfortress, which dropped the atomic bomb on Japan and ended the Second World War.

The new facilities are expected to be home to the 33rd fighter group (currently flying the famous P-51 Mustangs). In addition, the 33rd is expected to fly advanced jet fighters such as the Lockheed P-80 Shooting Star.

The new runway will be 13,000 feet long, and an additional five miles of perimeter fencing will be required. Construction is expected to start next month and take eighteen months.

Additional hangers, offices, quarters, and state-of-the-art research facilities will be constructed along with the runway. Mayor Weinrib said, "This expansion will put Roswell on the map, and we welcome all the new personnel and construction workers."
